ABOUT RANCHI

1. Ranchi is a picturesque city at an altitude of 2140 feet above sea level and offers scenic splendor along with man-made comforts and superb urban amenities. There are a number of waterfalls, rock formations and hillocks and several large industrial complexes worth more than one trip. The climate is adorable most of the year. Ranchi has a sub-tropical climate. During onset of winters (October) days are pleasant and nights are cool with a maximum temperature of 25°C and a minimum of 10°C.



2. Ranchi is well connected by air with Kolkata, Patna, Mumbai, New Delhi and Bangalore. It is well connected by rail with major cities across the country. It is situated on NH23 and NH33 and there are number good roads around it. Ranchi is directly connected by regular bus services with all the major places within and outside the state. AC volvo bus service is available for Ranchi-Kolkata, Ranchi-Jamshedpur and Ranchi-Patna route.

Places to see in and around Ranchi

Tagore Hill	4 kms north of the city, Tagore Hill stands like sentinel - on a hilltop.
Rock Garden	Next to picturesque Kanke Dam, this spot has been developed into an artificial garden, complete with waterfalls and sculptures, to attract tourists.
Dassam Fall	About 40 km away from Ranchi falling from a height of about 144 feet Kanchi river makes a pretty fall called Dassam falls encircled with charming scenes
Panch Gagh	About 40 kms from Ranchi near Khunti, Panch Ghagh is a lovely picnic spot amidst lush green forests
Hirni Fall	About 80 kms from Ranchi Hirni is another fascinating waterfall in charming surroundings. A little further up there's a bridge spanning the river and a shed.
Jonha Fall	Also known as Gautam Dhara as Lord Buddha is believed to have bathed here. A temple and ashram dedicated to Buddha was built
Jagannathpur Temple & Hill	Located 10km. south west of Ranchi is the 17th century Temple on a hillock. Rath yatra is held every year in the months of June/July. It attracts thousands of devotees
Hundru fall	Hundru fall is about 45 kms away from Ranchi situated on the Ranchi Purulia highway. The beauty of River Swarnarekha tumbling from a height of 320 feet is at its pristine best visitors may take a rejuvenating dip.
